CORRELATION OF CUB SCOUT ADVENTURE REQUIREMENTS TO PROJECT LEARNING TREE MATERIALS

THE COLLABORATION

The Boy Scouts of America entered into a Memorandum of Mutual Support with the Sustainable Forestry Initiative (SFI) in 2016. Part of the agreement entails the correlation of BSA program materials to SFI's award-winning environmental education program, Project Learning Tree (PLT).

PLT is designed for teachers and other educators, parents, and community leaders working with youth from preschool through grade 12. It offers lesson plans and activities for all ages that can be easily incorporated into existing curriculum or used in informal settings.

The correlation displayed on the following pages focuses on eight Cub Scout Adventures:

- Mountain Lion (Lion)
- Backyard Jungle (Tiger)
- Fur, Feathers, and Ferns (Bear)
- Grow Something (Wolf)
- Spirit of the Water (Wolf)
- Into the Wild (Webelos)
- Into the Woods (Webelos)



This correlation is designed to assist parents, den leaders, and Cubmasters in helping Cub Scouts meet the Adventure requirements.

The PLT activities provide fun and inspiring approaches for exploring the Adventure topics. Please note that they will not satisfy all the requirements a Cub Scout will need for the Adventure.
