Wildlife Biologist: I study wildlife to understand what they need to thrive. I look at how birds, mammals, fish, reptiles, or amphibians depend on the forest and on each other. *Why is this job important? Explain.*



Wildland Firefighter: My job is to help protect and maintain the health of the forest by controlling and putting out wildfires. I also talk to the public about ways they can help prevent wildfires. *Why is this job important? Explain.*



Forester: Foresters, or forest managers, oversee forestlands. I develop plans for planting trees, monitoring trees for healthy growth, and making sure these activities follow environmental laws. *Why is this job important? Explain.*



Park Ranger: I teach visitors about the forest and help keep them safe in the forest. I also enforce rules and laws to keep the forest safe from activities that could harm the forest. *Why is this job important? Explain.*



Forest Engineer: I design and supervise the building of roads, trails, bridges, and other construction projects in managed forests. I also identify any impacts these projects may have on forests. *Why is this job important? Explain.*



Logger: I harvest timber for building materials, furniture, paper, packaging, and many other products. My job is to cut the trees in a way that keeps water clean and ensures the health of the forest. *Why is this job important? Explain.*
